

## PROCLAMATION OF THE CHAIRMAN OF THE PINAL COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS DECLARING AN EMERGENCY FOR PINAL COUNTY

WHEREAS, between July 26, 2018 and July 29, 2018, three inch (3") of rain from summer monsoon storm fell in and around the Town of Mammoth, Arizona, causing significant flooding that damaged roadways, and caused asbestos-cement (AC) water pipes in the lower elevations of the town to lose pipeline integrity and release of water; and

WHEREAS, the damages to the water distribution system has caused and continues to cause cascading line failure throughout the system resulting in condition which endangers the life and property of the citizens of Pinal County in and around the Town of Mammoth; and

WHEREAS, floodwaters covered the roadways with debris, sand and gravel, damaged asphalt, and caused significant erosion, and

**WHEREAS**, Resolution No. 022410-DOE, passed and adopted by the Pinal County Board of Supervisors on February 24, 2010 authorizes the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors to declare that an emergency or local emergency exists; and

**WHEREAS**, the pursuant to A.R.S. § 26-311A and Resolution No. 022410-DOE the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is authorized to declare a condition of emergency exists in Pinal County; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT PROCLAIMED that a condition of emergency exists in Pinal County;

- a. The Pinal County Emergency Plan is hereby activated and in effect until further notice; and
- b. A Declaration of a State of Emergency by the State is requested to provide necessary resources and reimburse expenses associated with the flooding and preserving the health, welfare, and safety of citizens, and repair to infrastructure.
